Instant Coffee Bio

Instant Coffee [IC] is a service oriented curatorial and artist collective based in Toronto and Vancouver. Instant Coffee developed, in part, as a response to the division and exaggerated difference between studio and exhibition practice. Through formal installations and event-based activities, IC builds a public place to practice, where ideas, materials and actions can be explored outside of the isolated studio and in a manner that renegotiates traditional exhibition structures, but is still supported by them.

Instant Coffee has an extensive art practice, spanning over ten years. As an artist collective Instant Coffee has been invested in combining the social with the aesthetic, and as such have worked in public spaces to engage large audiences. They have shown internationally and have exhibited in many prominent art institutions as well has produced numerous Public Art projects. Instant Coffee recently produced three installation/performance projects, *Puff Puff*, *The Hero and The Villan* and *Take the Easy Way.* In 2012 two wall murals, *Perpetual Sunset*, a sequin sunset and *Blanket Mural* a sculptural wall mural for the City of Edmonton. Also in 2012 a colourful environment for the Southhill Community in Vancouver. As part of the City of Vancouver's Cultural Olympic programme, the Collective opened *Light Bar* a full-spectrum light bar installation and venue for light therapy, light lectures, light shows, light reading and light rock. In 2009 Instant Coffee exhibited the *Disco Fallout Shelter*, at the Toronto Sculpture Garden, and as part of Subvision, Hamburg; *Nooks* as part of How Soon is Now, Vancouver Art Gallery; Light Bar as part of Assume Nothing, New So-

cial Practice, Art Gallery of Greater Victoria; *Bright Future* as part of 88 Blocks Art on Main a Public Art Commission by Translink. Other residencies and exhibitions include, Artist In Residence, Sølyst, Denmark, *Light Bar* Research and Residency, Hotel Maria Kapel, The Netherlands, Kuenstlerhaeuser Worpswede, Germany, Flaggfabrikken Kunsthall, Bergen, Norway; *If You Lived Here You'd Be Home By Now*, Henry Art Gallery, Seattle; *Wish You Were Here*, Casa del Encuentro MDE07 encuentro internacional, Medellin, Colombia. Instant Coffee's current members are Jinhan Ko, Kelly Lycan, Khan Lee, and Jenifer Papararo.

Perpetual Sunset

80.5'w x 36' h x 4"d, reflective mylar disks, dibond, plastic pins, aluminum frame, Richmond BC, 2012.

Instant Coffee's shimmering mural Perpetual Sunset fills a west-facing wall, the mural made of nearly 40,000 individual reflective coloured sequins is designed to catch the natural light, most directly echoing the setting sun. This romantic gesture to portray, capture and stay the majesty of the sunset is an attempt to encapsulate a general appreciation for this natural happening, which begets an almost ritualistic representation of it. Instant Coffee builds on this shared infatuation of the sunset and the need to represent this every day event, but also wants to rival this desire by portraying it on a grand scale while simultaneously extending its physical properties. The sun rises and sets everyday, yet each occurrence is exceptional. How can something so familiar incite such awe?

Instant Coffee Blanket Sculpture

16'w x 9.5'h, steel, aluminum, laminated ink jet photo, Edmonton, Alberta 2012.

The completed sculpture consists of a heavy aluminum frame and triangular substrate panels where three separate photographs have been mounted mimicking common advertising boards or hand operated puzzle or coloured abstraction. Each panel can be turned individually. Three separate photographs of afghan blankets were chosen locally for their colour, design as well as other sentimental values yet still integrating Instant Coffee's own detritus and flashy aesthetics.

Instant Coffee: The hero, the villain, the salesman, the parent, a sidekick and a servant. Curated by Melanie O'brian. SFU Teck Gallery Vancouver, BC. 2013

The curtain closed on the hour every hour for 45 seconds.

This installation operates as a stage or set for social framing and interaction. Testing the highly trafficked Teck Gallery as a site for socially engaged contemporary art projects, the installation blurs the lines between the work, participants and audience. The hero, the villain, the salesman, the parent, a sidekick and a servant considers theatrical histories and the title evokes stock characters in Victorian melodramas. The work will treat Teck Gallery as the public site that it is, allowing for myriad social activities and configurations to play out within its framework over time.


Instant Coffee Light Bar

HMK, Hoorn, NL (Nov-Dec 2011) + Light Bar as part of *Bright Light*, Winter Olympic Games (Feb-Mar. 2010) + Light Bar part of *Assume Nothing: New Social Practice*, curated by Lisa Baldissera @ Art Gallery of Greater Victoria, BC (Jan-March 2009)

This installation was an elaborate and somewhat controlled setting for Light Therapy, Light Lectures, readings on Light, and Light Workshops. The open ended research and resulting installation doubled as a space where audience members were invited to simply hang out or participate as subjects of therapy, answering research questions, as well as enjoying the benefits of various light installations/therapy.

• IC Light Bar is a project commissioned by Vancouver Winter Olympic and Paralympic Public Art Program, an artist run centre and a contemporary art institution.





Nothing Happens in Good Weather

Alley 16' w x 80' L, fluorescent paint, wooden stumps, Vancouver BC, 2012

The South Hill neighbourhood of Vancouver is identified as one of under served, Instant Coffee artist collective was asked to create a design or a public work to address possible urban plights while galvanizing the community for more actions. The under-used and neglected alley way has been activated by colour and movable stumps. Numerous activities now take place in the alley,: photo shoots, skate boarding, music videos, picnics, and waiting for something to happen.

Instant Coffee Disco Fallout Shelter DFS

Variable dimensions, metal, brick, mirror tile, video and sound system, Subvision Art Festival, Hamburg, Germany & Toronto Sculpture Garden, Toronto, ON, 2009

Instant Coffee's DFS is a glitzed-up and powder coated re-articulation of the prolific and often make-shift mid-twentieth century places built from fear. A brightly coloured pathway leads to the shelter's sparkling entrance where a low bass beat can be heard from the dance music being played inside. At the end of the path is a small viewing kiosk containing a pre recorded video feed of Instant Coffee members playing records, eating spaghetti, dancing, reading, sleeping and just hanging out in the tight confines and under the protective barrier of shelter. At play here is the tenuous relationship between this exclusive lifesaving hideaway, the nature of the collective as being selective, and the viewing kiosk where those outside can only observe and imagine what is really happening inside.

- This installation was commissioned by the Toronto Sculpture Garden, a partnership between the City of Toronto, which owns and operates it as a city park, and the Louis L. Odette family, who created a non-profit foundation to fund the exhibitions. DFS was also commissioned by Subvision Arts Festival in Hamburg, Germany. Budget 20,000.
- In Toronto the DFS was open to the public for 6 months, the grass grew very long, in Hamburg it was up for 2 weeks.

Bright Future

Four public art works for 88 blocks Art on Main—a public art program for the Main Street corridor, Vancouver, BC, 2009

Bright Future comprised a suite of temporary and permanent public artworks. The temporary were installed on three articulated trolley buses and a bus shelter on Main Street. *Blanket Bus* completely wrapped an articulated trolley in five different crocheted afghan blanket patterns. Inside of a second trolley artworks commissioned by artists from North, Central and South America and Europe were displayed in place of the usual commercial advertisements the public were invited to text vote for their favourite artwork inside the bus. *Instant Coffee Light Bar Bus Shelter* was an installation in a bus shelter on Main Street which provides the public with S.A.D. light therapy while waiting for the bus. *Say Nothing in Bright Colours* entailed seven brightly painted sandwich boards bearing hand-painted slogans installed on the sidewalk.

- Public Art Commissioned by Translink and the City of Vancouver. Budget 42,000
- The duration of this public art was 6 months to 1 year.
